Primary Sport Premium Expenditure 2018-19

In 2018-2019, our school will receive £17,606 sport funding from the Government. Schools have to spend the sport funding on improving the provision of PE and sport, but they have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses of Funding

Possible uses of funding can include:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- Paying for professional development opportunities in PE/ sport
- Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- Running sport competitions, and/or increasing participation in school games
- Providing places for pupils in after school sports clubs
- Introducing new sports or activities to encourage more pupils to take up sport

Contributing towards swimming lessons for Years 3 and 6 and additional staffing costs to accompany children £5365

Attending sports competitions and related staff cover costs £2370

Membership fee for Sports Partnership £500

Staff training (costs for training and cover costs) £2000

Curriculum Focus of Primary sports premium spending

Stepney Greencoat have a long tradition of supporting and participating in sport and PE activities, and encouraging a healthy lifestyle for all our children. The additional PE/sport funding enables us to develop this further and protect current levels of provision.

Measuring the impact of the sports premium spending

The school evaluates the impact of provision at the end of each term and at the end of the academic year. Groups and individual pupils receive targeted support to raise their sporting achievement.

PE lessons are monitored as part of the whole school monitoring policy.

Year 6 pupils will complete their swimming lessons towards the end of the summer term and we will be able to report then the percentage of pupils who can:

- Swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres
- Use a range of strokes confidently
- Perform safe self- rescue in different water based situations
